

WHAT IS A DEVELOPMENTAL SERVICES WORKER?

A **developmental services worker (DSW)** supports people who have a developmental disability by enhancing their capacity to function in community living settings and in society. DSWs are employed by organizations that support individuals with special needs including faith- and culture-based agencies and by school boards to assist in the classroom.¹

ALGONQUIN COLLEGE DSW APPRENTICESHIP PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

PROGRAM CODE 0596X06FWO

The apprenticeship certificate program supports participants that are registered as DSWs with the Ministry of Training, Colleges and Universities (MTCU).

This program provides the 780 hours of in school training as set by the MTCU's apprenticeship training standards. The in-school training program consists of 12 reportable outcomes that are completed through a series of courses offered per semester.

Courses are delivered in a variety of formats including face to face in a classroom or lab, hybrid (combination of classroom and online learning) and online. Apprentices participate in all three types of learning and are expected to attend all classes. Apprentices may develop individual academic plans with the program coordinator based upon needs and goals of the apprentice and his/her employer. In this delivery option, an apprentice may choose any number of a select group of courses offered each semester. In this way the apprentice may complete the program at a slower or faster pace than stated above. Attention to course prerequisites is necessary when developing an academic plan.

Upon completion of the MTCU DSW apprenticeship certificate program, students have the option to earn their DSW Ontario College Diploma through Algonquin College by completing one semester of the two year program.

ADVANCED STANDING AND EXEMPTIONS

The apprentice may qualify for advanced standing based on work experience and previous courses completed. Students interested in advanced standing through Prior Learning Assessment and Recognition (PLAR) or course exemptions should talk with the program coordinator.

If eligible, apprentices should complete this process as soon as possible.
